PRESS RELEASE

September 29, 2020

On Monday, September 28, 2020 at 3:36 PM, Harris County Precinct 8 Deputies were dispatched to the El Dorado View apartment complex in the 200 block of El Dorado Blvd in reference to an Attempted Burglary. The reporting witness stated that a male was attempting to make entry into several apartments and was also seen attempting to break into a vehicle in the parking lot. The caller told Precinct 8 dispatchers that the male was still on the scene and was now sitting in a black GMC SUV.

Sgt. M. Ford and Deputy B. Williams arrived on scene and located the male suspect sitting in the described vehicle and immediately detained him for investigation. The defendant was identified as 47 year old Charles Ray Anderson. While detained, Anderson was positively identified by the reporting witness as the suspect attempting to break into apartments and a parked vehicle.

Upon further investigation, Deputies J. Gomez and H. Eder discovered that Anderson had actually made entry into an occupied residence. After speaking with the victim, it was learned that while she was sleeping in her bedroom, she was awakened by someone touching her feet and observed Anderson standing over her. The victim stated she became startled and Anderson exited the bedroom and sat on the couch in her living room. Anderson then reentered the bedroom and began to put his pants on which were laying on the floor. The victim stated she observed Anderson wearing shorts at the time of initial contact and did not know he had removed his pants while she slept. Anderson then exited her apartment and the victim immediately notified a neighbor. The neighbor was able to pull up video footage of Anderson making entry into the apartment as well as trying to break into other apartments.

After speaking with the victim, Deputies made entry into her apartment to further conduct their investigation and located condoms, socks and car keys in the hallway. Deputies observed that Anderson was not wearing socks and confirmed the keys found were to that of the black GMC SUV Anderson was located in.

The Harris County District Attorney's Office was contacted and a 1st degree felony charge of Burglary of an Occupied Habitation with Intent to Commit an Assault was accepted. Anderson was taken into custody and was transported to the Harris County Joint Processing Center. Anderson's bond has been set at \$40,000.
