PRESS RELEASE

May 11, 2021

On Monday, May 3, 2021 at approximately 3:59 PM, Precinct 8 Deputy B. Williams was dispatched to the Walgreens located in the 16500 block of El Camino Real in Clear Lake in regards to a shoplifting call. The suspect was said to have stolen cosmetics. He then returned to the store approximately an hour later and stole over \$1,000 worth of electronics. Deputy Williams viewed the video footage and recognized the suspect as 38 year old Jason Terrell Dorsey, who is known to Precinct 8 Deputies from previous cases involving Theft and Criminal Trespass to name a few. Deputy Williams contacted the Harris District Attorney's Office who accepted felony Theft w/Previous Convictions. An arrest warrant was issued for this case.

On Wednesday, May 5, 2021 at approximately 4:26 PM, Deputy B. Williams was dispatched to the CVS Pharmacy located in 900 block of Bay Area Blvd in reference to a theft in progress. The caller stated that the suspect was a known patron who has stolen from this location in the past and currently has a Criminal Trespass warning to this location. In this case, the suspect was said to have filled up a bag with electronics and left the store without paying. The description of the suspect given matched that of Jason Terrell Dorsey. Deputy Williams located Dorsey across the street, detained him and confiscated the stolen items. The Harris County District Attorney's Office was contacted and charges of felony Theft w/Previous Convictions were accepted on this case. Dorsey was booked on this case in addition to the case from May 3rd. His bond was set at \$1,500 for the first case and \$2,500 for this case.

On Friday, May 7, 2021 at approximately 7:48 AM, Lieutenant C. Yetter observed Dorsey exit the Walgreens located in the 16500 block of El Camino Real carrying merchandise in both arms. Dorsey was observed placing the items in a shopping cart and attempting to leave the location. Dorsey was immediately detained and contact was made with the store manager. The manager stated Dorsey walked into the store, took the merchandise and exited the store without paying. The Harris County District Attorney's Office was contacted and accepted a felony charge of Theft w/Previous Convictions. Dorsey was booked into the Harris County Joint Processing Center. His bond has been set at \$2,000, and he was later released on a General Order bond. It was noted that Dorsey has been charged 17 previous times for Theft since 2006.
