PRESS RELEASE

On Thursday, April 8, 2021 at approximately 5:36 AM, Precinct 8 Deputies were dispatched to the 15200 block of McConn St. in Webster in reference to a disturbance. The reporting witness observed a male break a glass bottle in a resident's driveway. The male was then observed cursing and yelling obscenities in the street.

Upon arrival, Deputies were able to locate and detain the male causing the disturbance. He was identified as 38 year old George Alfredo Seaman, who is known to Precinct 8 Deputies from previous cases. Over the past several years, our office has received numerous calls to Seaman's residence for various disturbances and reports of criminal mischief to name a few. While on the scene, Deputy Conway was able to review video footage which showed Seaman in the street throwing an object into the resident's driveway. Seaman is then seen walking out to the street again where he began yelling obscenities.

The Harris County District Attorney's Office was contacted and accepted charges for Harassment. Seaman was transported to our Clear Lake Station for processing. While in the Precinct 8 booking room, Seaman began to kick the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) machine. Deputies were able to safely secure Seaman to a bench away from the machine, however he continued to kick the bench directly in front of him causing further damage. The Harris County District Attorney's Office was contacted again and accepted charges for Criminal Mischief. His bond has been set at \$10,000 total for those cases.

Earlier this week, Precinct 8 Deputy A. Peters filed a separate felony Stalking case on George Seaman based on several incidents involving threatening, destructive and intimidating behavior on his part. In one instance, Seaman was captured on video using a baseball bat to cause damage to a resident's property. We are expecting an arrest warrant to be forthcoming on that charge.

At the time of Seaman's arrest yesterday, he was out on bond awaiting trial for yet another case involving Criminal Mischief filed by Precinct 8 in 2020. In that case, Seaman caused extensive damage to a vehicle of another resident in his neighborhood.
